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ACADEMIC & ATHLETIC BALANCE

Carrabassett Valley Academy (CVA) uses a traditional college preparatory curriculum. All students prepare for and pursue one of five major athletic offerings: alpine ski racing, freestyle skiing, ski cross racing, snowboarding, or backcountry skiing/snowboarding.

A balanced schedule affords all students the ability to incorporate top-notch competitive athletic programs into their daily routine while carrying a full academic load of five courses. The student:teacher ratio of 7:1 allows students to work with teachers to maximize the balance between rigorous academics and world-class athletics.

ACADEMIC INDEPENDENCE

CVA students learn to be responsible for, and take pride in their studies. Students are expected to keep pace with their classes on training and competition trips. CVA students develop into independent, motivated learners that are communicative and proactive.

ACADEMIC CURRICULUM

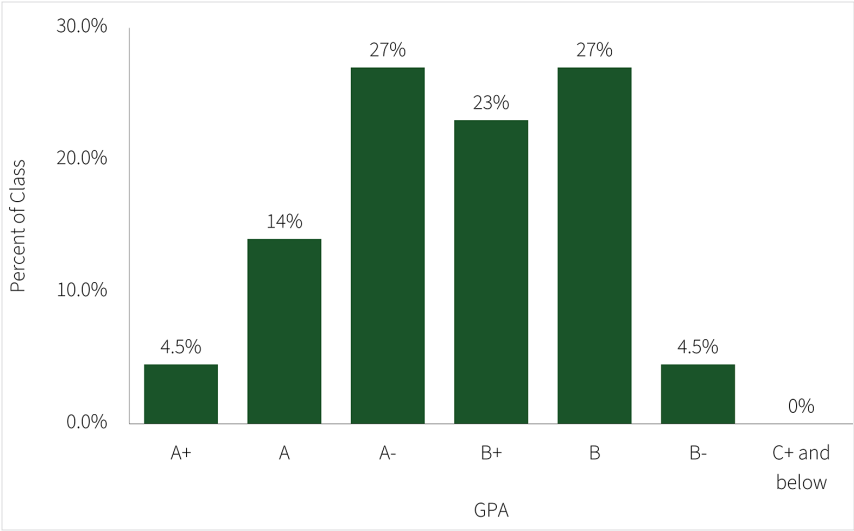
